AUSTRALIA—EU NEWS

Aus-EU Free Trade Agreement

The negotiations for the FTA were opened between Australia and the EU in January 2018. The first round of negotiations completed in Brussels on July 2-6 2018 and the second round completed in Canberra November 19-23 2018. A third round of negotiations have been scheduled for March 2019.

EU NEWS

Brexit

The UK is scheduled to leave the EU on March 29 2019. The deadline for a deal is drawing near with the parliamentary vote in UK already being postponed in December 2018 by Prime Minister May, when she realised the bill would be soundly defeated. The result for the vote held the 15th of January was the same despite the extra time and urging of May to accept the deal. The loss margin of 230 votes is the biggest defeat of a ruling party in almost 100 years. The outcome leaves the future of Brexit uncertain with the possibility of a no-deal Brexit or no Brexit at all both equally likely.

European Elections

May 23rd to May 26 2019, Europeans will have the opportunity to choose their 705 MEPs for the next five years. It will be the first elections since 1979 where the vote will not take place in the UK with only the remaining 27 member states able to take part in the vote.

EU Politics Brief

Greece

The Greek Prime Minister, Alexis Tsipras has said he will call for a vote of confidence after his government lost the majority with the resignation of ally Panos Kammenos. The resignation was in protest to a deal made last year for the name change of Macedonia, in preparation for the Balkan country to join the EU.

France

Emmanuel Macron, the French president will launch ‘the great national debate’ in Normandy the 15th of January to address the concerns brought by the *gilets jaunes* movement. Mr Macron is asking for ideas from french

citizens on the topics of taxes, public spending, public services, the environment and democracy.

Poland

On January 13th Pawel Adamowicz, the mayor of Gdansk was murdered at a charity event gala. The event occurs at a time of continued political polarisation in Poland. Mr Adamowicz was known for his liberal views, being pro-immigrant and pro-LGBT.

Italy - Poland

Matteo Salvini, Italy's deputy prime minister will travel to Poland to meet with the leader of the ruling party (PIS) Jaraslaw Kaczynski . The meeting is to discuss the possibility of forming an alliance of the right wing for the upcoming European Parliament elections. Salvini, the leader of Italy's League party (Lega) has continued his criticisms of the EU and his desire to create reform since being elected in 2018.

Hungary

There have been recent protests in Hungary in response to the passing of the "slave law" in parliament early January. The law allows employers to demand more overtime from workers and to delay payments for up to three years. The protests were led by female MPs, all staunch opponents of the far right Prime Minister, Viktor Orban.
